In July of 2021, another friend of mine, Kevin Hume, asked me to write him a piece just like Alpha Bravo Niner, but for 8 players. The result is this piece. I tried to use introductory rhythms and techniques that could be played by first or second-year players.

(Though, I tend to dig in a little more on my hi-hat parts, sorry about that).

I followed the naming convention of Alpha Bravo Niner by adopting words that I thought I remembered being used in military communication, and later learned to be part of the NATO Phonetic Alphabet.
