When Kevin and Matt asked me to write a concert ensemble for their middle school percussion section, they asked for it to incorporate marching percussion as well. I thought it would be nice if the music for drumline could help to establish technique as well as groove. I used the concept of double-beat to set the tone for the entire piece. As I recall, the opening vibraphone line popped into my head while I was driving one day, and the rest of the piece unfolded from there. When I delivered the piece to Pea Ridge, Matt McCool said he thought it sounded like a spy movie with the drumline part sounding like a chase scene. I thought the title "Security Breach" would fit that nicely. You can let your imagination fill out the rest of the story.

You will see that the drumline parts aren't included on any of the concert instrument parts, but instead, each instrument is printed on a separate page.

This is to allow you to devise who should be assigned to each instrument.

The hi-hat player will be the only musician who won't move to a marching instrument.

The vibraphone player will also act as the transition between the concert and marching sections, so their vibraphone will need to be positioned somewhat close to their marching instrument section.
